



There was certificate distribution for all the student presenters as well as the Anchor, Ms.Navita Kohli.


Overall the session was informative, interactive and a learning experience for the students as well as the faculty members.



4. Poster Making Competition


It was conducted with an objective to enable the students, faculty and staff to gain wider understanding and stronger support for productivity movement for sustainable socio economic development.

1. Special talk on Circular Economy and Sustainability.



Dr. B. Sengupta, Former Member Secretary, Central Pollution Control Board, Ministry of Environment & Forest, Govt. of India and Shri S.K. Agarwal, Vice President, Delhi Productivity Council and Chairman & Managing Director, GNG Group who gave a talk on Current Environmental Issues in India with special reference to sustainability and Circular Economy. 3. <u>Inter Class – Symposium</u>







The book of conference proceedings was then released by the guests.




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Welcome Address by Dr. Ravi K. Dhar, Director, JIMS, Vasant Kunj

Dr Ravi K Dhar extended a warm welcome to the Chief Guest, and other guests through his welcome address. He welcomed the speaker and the audience along with the faculty of JIMS VK. He gave a short introduction on the topic, sustainable development, and described it as the balance between development goals and use of natural resources in the ecosystem.

He also talked about climate change with respect to People, Planet, and Partnership and how the Vedas and the Dharmas of Hindu religion are linked to it. Dr. Dhar included various examples and references to repetitive cycles occurring in nature and the importance of natural resources.

He ended his note by mentioning noteworthy instances of ethical issues in business which resulted in damaging the ecosystem.


Professor S. C. Sharma, Director IBS Gurgaon (Keynote Speaker)

Prof S. C. Sharma started his keynote with references to India's multiple growth rates till date. He talked about the standard of living of India as a developing country and compared it to that of a developed country.

He also linked short-term and long-term success to Sustainable development by giving examples of success stories of businesses like the East India Company, which attained a high level of corporate sustainable development. He interlinked and described the importance of Individual sustainable development and corporate sustainable development.

He described a successful business as the one which focuses on three questions while producing.

- What to produce
- How to produce
- For whom to produce

Dr. M. K. Bhatt, Director MAIMS (Guest of Honor)


Dr. Bhatt started his talk by giving examples of various business leaders prevailing in the current market. He divided development in two types, namely

- Materialistic
- Human

Materialistic is the one which consists of Self-Interest, greed, ownership etc. Human development consists of committee development, trusteeship, conservation of resources etc. According to him, choosing between Materialistic and Human development is the biggest dilemma the businesses face now a days.

He also debunked various myths and religious practices from the Bhagavat Geeta which results in economic and resource drain. He focused on sustainable development in economical development without harming nature.

He concluded his talk by making the point that sustainable knowledge is as important as sustainable development.

Dr Jai Prakash Sharma, Professor of Corporate Governance and Law, GRFCG (Chief Guest)

Dr J. P. Sharma introduced the topic with the help of three P's


- People
- Planet
- Profit

He explained the importance of every P with respect to the topic of the conference. He spoke about the Vedas and their importance in sustainable development, for example, Air is god and hence should not be polluted.

He explained the difference between sustainability and responsibilities. He also gave three major approaches to business so far, namely,


- Shareholders Approach
- Stakeholders Approach
- Corporate Social Responsibilities Approach

Dr Sharma concluded his talk by talking about the CSR fund laws of India and how public welfare, as a responsibility of the government, is the key to sustainable development in India.

The inaugural session came to an end with the felicitation of the panelists with mementos followed by a Vote of Thanks by Dr. Nidhi Gupta, wherein she thanked all the guests for taking out time and enlightening the students.

Session II PANEL DISCUSSION

The session started with welcoming all the guests, faculties and students to the Session II of the conference that comprised of Panel Discussion. All the guests were welcomed with Planters by the faculties thereafter all the guests were introduced to the audience.

The session was coordinated by Dr. Himani Gupta and Mr. Vipul Singh.

Dr. Urvashi Sharma, Associate Professor, Department of Commerce, Delhi School of Economics was the moderator for the session which consisted of the following panellists.

Dr. Urvashi Sharma, the moderator, started with an introduction of the topic at hand. She talked about how focus of business models needed to shift from profit to prosperity. She continued, exploring how sustainability should not be an agenda just for the government and the ministers who occupy it, but also us citizens. She talked about the importance of starting at a micro level in order to achieve sustainability, and the rise of concepts such Green HR, Green marketing, and sustainable agriculture. She reflected upon discussion of the previous session, that of themes of oneness with nature in old Indian Hindu and Buddhist texts. She emphasized our need to take care of the planet, as it was the only resource given to us. She talked about how every country had a different level of different, giving an analogy to the different levels of an airplane. She also talked about the 17 SDGs, and their range from poverty to climate change, after which she moved the discussion to the panelists, starting with Dr. Gautam Goswami, the director of TIFAC, a technology think tank.

Dr. Gautam Goswami talked about the Indian context vis-a-vis the 17 SDGs and India's commitment to responding to climate change. He talked about how the public discourse on climate change had evolved over the last twenty years, and how two schools of thought existed on the subject. The first school of thought was that the earth goes through periodic change, and was simply in a change period, the conclusion being that the onus of climate change was not on us as a species, rather that this was a natural process taking place. Subscribers of the other school of thought, that climate was man made and should be taken seriously, of course felt an urgency to take action. He clarified that the Indian government, and India, as nation, believed in taking serious action to combat climate change, and had indeed been very successful in accomplishing the targets that had been put forward.

He discussed the unprecedented intensity and frequency with which natural disasters such as draughts, fires, and floods were taking place. Climate change was an international topic of discussion, with the Kyoto Protocol being a major milestone, in which developed countries agreed to commit to curb greenhouse gas emissions. He moved onto the 2015 Paris agreement, where the lobby of developing countries was on a stronger footing. He gave a rudimentary explanation of the greenhouse effect. He talked about the two approaches to solving climate change, which were mitigation and adaptation. He then elaborated upon the three Paris Agreement goals, two of which India is well on its way to meet before the 2030 deadline.

The first goal is for India's greenhouse gas emission intensity of its GDP to be reduced by 33-35 per cent below 2005 levels by 2030. The second goal is 40 percent of India's power capacity to be based on non-fossil fuel sources. And finally, the third goal is for India to

create an additional 'carbon sink' of 2.5 to 3 billion tonnes of Co2 equivalent through additional forest and tree cover by 2030.

He talked about how tackling climate change was imperative for obtaining a good lifestyle and health, and for capacity building. He also talked about how he was involved in technology forecasting in his professional life. He elaborated how his team maintained a database of technologies of 6 different sectors that are needed in India to achieve each of the goals mentioned before, and which countries could provide these technologies. He emphasized again that India was very serious regarding the climate change problem, and that India was always on time in submission of reports and overall communication, and that many programmes had been launched to combat climate change.

He concluded by stressing he was confident that India would be able to meet the aforementioned goals it had set for itself.




Dr. Gautam Goswami discussing the climate concerns.

Thereafter Dr. Urvashi Sharma requested Mr. Amrender Pandey for his insight.

Mr. Amrender Pandey talked about the employment and education aspect of the SDGs, and the dilemma of reducing poverty and developing the nation at the same time as curbing CO_2 emission. He talked about how many sectors, such as the fishing sector, had been mismanaged, leading to dire consequences. He talked about how forests were essential, as they absorbed CO_2 , reversing some of the potential harm to the climate. He discussed the importance of development and reduction in poverty, and how these goals were not directly in line with the goal to curb emissions. He talked about the dire state of Education in our country, where 18 to 32 year olds constituted to about 65% of the population, and 7% out of them being properly educated.

He highlighted the extremely low and unsatisfactory number of institutions and universities in our country. He also mentioned the positive change taking place in this regard, that Delhi Government schools seemed to being doing well in recent times. He contrasted this with the country as a whole, which was still not doing well in terms of education. He brought attention to the fact that people were not employable, and did not have the requisite skills and education to find a job. He further mentioned that there was a lack of proper data for this. He then talked about the role of our country in the 17 SDGs, and the question and dilemma of increasing production and business. He talked about his work, in which his team administered communication skills to students who have passed 12th grade, in order to increase their employability in the service sector. He talked about the need for policy and wages to accomplish the SDGs. He concluded by discussing scarcity of water and how 2 billion of the current 7.5 billion population did not have access to safe drinking water.

Thereafter Dr. Urvashi Sharma invited Mr. Dhruv Pandey into the Discussion.


Mr. Dhruv Pandey, manager of profile and innovation at Social Alpha, talked about the current state of Healthcare in India, and his approach to social work, by creating scalable business models that are capable of being independent by creating revenue.

He gave an introduction the third SDG, that of a healthy life and wellbeing for all. He listed some facts, on the basis of which he built a hypothesis for successful social work. He talked

about how the Indian healthcare had made rapid strides, by decreasing the infant mortality rate, the maternal mortality rate, eradicating polio, eliminating tetanus. The industry as a whole growing, at 15.8% CAGR. He examined the shifting health burden on the industry as India transitioned from a low to a middle income country, shifting from communicable to non-communicable diseases such as cancer, hypertension, and diabetes. He talked about the problem of the crippling infrastructure of the healthcare sector. According to WHO recommendations, 1 doctor should be present for every hundred citizens. But in India, 1 doctor is present for every 2000 citizens, putting a lot of burden on each practitioner. In India, patients spent about 61% out of pocket on healthcare, in contrast to China, where citizens only paid 21% out of pocket for the same. He discussed his hypothesis, on which he has based his work, that the current healthcare system is not scalable, with a big problem of accessibility. Medical practitioners were often forced to migrate to cities in order to earn a livelihood, which left rural communities vulnerable and lacking basic healthcare infrastructure. He talked about two approaches to solving this problem, one of which was to 'throw money at the problem', and the second was to 'throw people at the problem'. He personally believed in the second approach.

He emphasized the importance of creating an environment where people can rise up from the bottom of the pyramid. He talked about how innovative solutions could come out of such an environment. He highlighted that such businesses and projects did not have to be loss-making, and could have a focused revenue model. He talked about his belief in combining innovation and entrepreneurship, to create jobs and have an impact. He recounted a success story of an 8 person team, which successfully created a portable MRI machine, and how this exemplified Indian contextual innovation.

He concluded by discussing how huge problems could be tackled by building a sustainable mechanism which could work in absence of external stimuli. He also talked about how the intention of the entrepreneur mattered, and he or she had to work in the realm of ethics and morals.

Dr. Urvashi Sharma, the moderator provided an interlude, with talk of the PURA (Providing Urban Amenities to Rural Areas) model, and how rural problems had to be given more thought, before inviting the next panelist Mr. Kartikay Malhotra.


Mr. Kartikay Malhotra, Technical Manager at Samsung, talked about the CSR (Corporate Social Responsibility) programme of the company, and about the work they did to promote education and skill development. He started by giving a brief introduction of Seema Nagar, a star employee at Samsung, who had a humble background and benefitted from the education programme provided by them. He discussed Samsung's approach of Society, Environment and Economy, which directly corresponded to People, Planet and Partnership, the theme of the conference.

He communicated that this programme was a global effort, with numerous NGOs, governments, stakeholders and local communities involved. He then discussed more in detail about the effort in India, focusing on the People, or Education aspect, with which he was most familiar. Samsung employs 70,000 people. In its goal on education, Samsung's effort in India include three tiers. The lowest tier consists of Smart Classes, to which amenities such as tables, chairs, other infrastructure is donated. The middle tier consists of Technical Schools. And lastly, the top tier consists of the Digital Academy, with classes taught in premier institutes such IITs and NITs. These courses include classes on emerging fields such as Big Data Analysis, Artificial Intelligence, Cloud Computing, etc. The two

reasons given for their effort were enhancing brand image, and facilitating innovation at the highest level-- the highest level here referring the premier status of IITs and NITs on a national level.

He further talked about various scholarships offered to fund educational fees of exceptional students. He talked about the Technical Schools, which focused on skill development, arts, customer service education, soft skills, and teaching students how to survive in today's job environment.

He concluded by highlighting how one-third of India was covered by the circumference of the combined digital academics, and Samsung"s continued work in education,

Before introducing the next panelist, Dr. Urvashi Sharma continued further about Corporate Social Responsibility, and the shifting focus from charity to training and education, and laws pertaining to the same.

Ms. Devakshi Dhawan, founder of Hope Collective, a non-profit organization focused on micro-financing, acting as an online marketplace for various NGOs, was the next panellist. Also the manager of portfolio and programme at Social Alpha, she mainly talked about Social Entrepreneurship, and her experiences from Hope Collective and Social Alpha. She relayed anecdotes from her time at Hope Collective, and talked about the power of conscious consumption. She talked about the business model of Hope Collective, and how

they focused on quality products above all else. Social Entrepreneurship is booming today, and sustainability is largely contextual. She narrated the story of a start-up that made incense sticks from flowers dumped into the river, and employed self-help groups of women, effectively decreasing pollution, making biodegradable products, and employing local women, all at the same time. She talked about how consumers were shifting focus, and consuming products more consciously. She gave examples of such products, from organic colours, to eco-friendly ganesh idols. She highlighted the huge role of people or consumers in shifting to better products.

She discussed the change in consumer expectations, where consumers had previously objected to the expensive price tag of the handcrafted products, and asked for discounts. Now, she informed everyone, consumers were more sensitive to the already low margins of some of the handcrafted products, and did not object to higher prices, instead choosing to support local artisans. She stressed the need to realize that profitability and sustainability in such a context were one and the same thing. She talked about the role of entrepreneurship in solving problems.

She concluded by alluding to the aphorism, "Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime", which highlighted the need for sustainable business over charity.


Thereafter Dr. Urvashi Sharma requested Prof. B. C. Barah to give his perspectives.

Mr. B. C. Barah, Professor at Indian Agricultural Research Institute, talked about innovations for SDGs, agricultural sustainability and food security, with a focus on policy. He introduced the first three SDGs: poverty, hunger and health. His experience being in agriculture, his talk focused on the second SDG, hunger. He started the talk by quoting Norman Borlaug, "Food is the moral right of all who are born into this world." He gave a quick introduction to the history of agriculture in India, from Green revolution, White revolution, to fish production. He revealed that percent of people suffering poverty and hunger had more than halved due to these advances in agriculture. He continued, that according to statistics, investing one dollar for reduction in malnutrition yielded sixteen dollars in return for the country.

Through visual aids, he showed the 'two sides of India', one of prosperity, and the other a broken face, signifying the farmer. He explained that changing the current agricultural scenario was a daunting task, and that growth of productivity for rice and wheat had an unfortunate steep decline. He highlighted the stark regional disparity in agricultural production. Going back to 1990s, he explored the persistent crisis and food insecurity that lingered to this day. He further went on to discuss the decline in the poverty ratio, in parallel to the poverty population remaining unchanged. He talked about the poverty scenario in East India, which suffered from the aforementioned start regional disparity. He discussed the risks associated in agriculture, the primary source of which being Yield Risk, and Price Risk. He explored how risk due to pest and disease had increased in recent times. Risk due to micronutrients had also increased.

He discussed how farmers were especially vulnerable to climate change, how resources were under stress. The per capita availability of water was decreasing, again decreasing food security as a consequence. He further examined agrarian distress. By 2050, he argued, the population of the world would increase to nine billion people, causing a huge rise in demand of food. There would need to be a hundred percent increase in agricultural productivity to accommodate this additional demand. He stressed the need for government spending, huge projects and convergence of existing programmes.

He concluded by discussing system of rice intensification, and how poor farmers needed technological assistance to produce more and use less water. He highlighted the importance of science, practice and policy making.


Thereafter Dr. Urvashi Sharma requested the last panelist Ms. Ranjna Khanna to share her views with the panel and the audience.

The last panellist, **Ms. Ranjna Khanna**, Director at Impact Investors Council, gave a global perspective on the SDGs, also talking about blended financing and the rise of impact investing. She started by talking about social injustice, the scenario 50 years back, and how the brightest minds with professional expertise and educational qualifications were working on the toughest problems facing our planet. She talked about some the results of the SDGs, such as the 471 million people who had been lifted out of poverty, and 111 million more who would we indirectly impacted. She highlighted that this was an investment opportunity. Financing had become a big challenge, she explained. She talked about how 3.9 trillion dollars was needed per year to achieve the SDGs, and as of now, despite philanthropy, corporate social responsibility and other funding, there was a shortage of 2.5 trillion dollars, still. She discussed impact investing, and defined it as for-profit investments with commercial returns and social impact. She talked about the importance of being self-financed in this regard.

She then talked about her work, supporting twelve sectors, such as affordable education, health, housing, agriculture, etc. She discussed how impact investing had been on the rise globally, and more companies were interested in the concept. She discussed how impact investing included sustainable investing, with positive social impact and the significance of intent. Bottom of the pyramid problem solving was more desirable as it lead to sustainable growth.

The 2016 market size of impact investing was 5.2 billion dollars, experiencing a 14% growth. She conveyed that eight crore lives had been touched by innovative solutions from such investing. Ten years ago, she relayed, the top ten percent of the population had been the focus, but today the paradigm was shifting, with the underserved population receiving more attention.

She concluded by talking about Social Impact Bonds, Development Impact Bonds, and Blended Finance.

The session was concluded by Dr. Urvashi Sharma by extending the ongoing conversation and talking about how a safe operating space was needed for humanity.

After the end of the Session II on Panel Discussion all the guests and faculty and staff were requested to join for lunch.


Session III Technical I

This session aimed to provide a platform for exchange of ideas and experiences between researchers, students, faculty members and all the other people concerned with regard to the theme of this session: Business Sustainability in the 21st century: Managing People, Planet & Profit.

The session was started by introducing the session chair, Prof. B.C. Barah and the session cochair, Dr. Nidhi Gupta, Head of the Department of Management of Studies, JIMS, Vasant Kunj and highlighting the importance of Business Sustainability.

Thereafter the commencement of research paper presentations was announced to begin the session.

Ms. Nancy Rao, Research Scholar, Department of Commerce, Delhi School of Economics, University Delhi, was the first presenter for the session whose title of research was "Kingfisher Airlines' Failure (with reference to Ethical and Governance Issues). She brought together all the possible reasons causing the epic fail of the airlines from recurring losses to unpaid fuel dues with IOC, BPCL, and HPCL to bank arrears and from Mallya's supposedly wrong strategy to frequent changes in the business models and auditor's disagreement to dubious role of bankers. At the end of her presentation, she was questioned by the Session Chair and Prof. Bhushan Manchanda about the lessons learnt from this failure story.

Ms. Seema Wadhawan, Assistant Professor, Gitarattan International Business School, presented her paper titled, "Factors influencing Employee Engagement of Millenial :Study of Telecom Sector Delhi. She provided a brief introduction of the challenges in dealing with the generation Y and also categorized employees into engaged and disengaged employees. Later in her presentation, she listed the factors which affected employee engagement, namely,

- Work content
- Supervisory support
- Career development
- Rewards and recognition
- Work life balance

of which, rewards and recognition turned out to be the most important factor influencing employee engagement in the Telecom sector in Delhi.

Mr. Radheyshyam Kalawat, Research Scholar, Department of Commerce, Delhi School of Economics, University Delhi, shared the findings from his paper titled, "Emerging Challenges and Reforms in Labour Laws in the State of Rajasthan". He introduced the audience to the terminology related to Labour Laws, such as, the CLRA, IDA, Factory Act, Indian Labour Reforms and also the relationship between employee and the employer, and henceforth mentioned the existing gaps in the system which have been hindering the progress rate.

As per the findings of his research paper, the impacts of the amendments in the laws were,

- It was more flexible to hire employees
- The process had been simplified as per to operate in the Make In India campaign.

The question that arose at the end of his presentation was that how he thinks that this paper was anywhere close to contributing towards any of the Sustainable Development Goals. To which he answered that the flexibility of the labour laws will benefit the employer and the employee, and their work relationship as well. He added that the simplification of the laws will eventually simplify the process.

Ms. Jasmeet Kaur, with her research highlighted the impact of clothing industry on the environment, how the wear and throw goes in the landfills, and how the production process in the first place affects the environment. Her research paper explained the journey of a fibre to fabric and answered questions like why do we need sustainability in the textile department? Major answer points were that, there is a high amount of water consumed in the process, solutions like caustic soda are used and many other wasteful affluent as well, and water waste

is released without proper treatment. To rectify these mistakes, she suggested to opt fast fashion. Fast fashion includes, reuse, recycle, eco-friendly dies, organic fabrics, and using dead stock. At the end of her presentation, she was questioned on how to use the wasted garments?

To which she rightly answered and suggested to adopt slow fashion, improvise, less exploitation of resources and their conscious consumption.

This brought an end to the session.

SESSION IV Technical II

The technical session II under Session IV had the theme Sustainable Development Goal: 2030. The session was coordinated by Dr. Shruti Bhuttani & Ms. Suchitra Srivastav. Under this session the students from the college and other institutes were given an opportunity to speak out their mind on the theme and the audience had the opportunity of asking questions from the researchers.

The sessions was opened by welcoming all in attendance and inviting the session chair Dr. S. K. Dogra and session co-chair Dr. Sartaj Khera on the dais.

Dr. Dogra invited the students to present their research to the audience.

The first presentation was by Mr. Ishu Singhal and Mr. Pundrikaksh Das under the guidence of Dr. Himani Gupta on the topic "To study the knowledge and perception with respect to Swatch Bharat Abhiyan among slum people of Bhalswa slum in Narela, New Delhi". The students had carried out extensive research and had presented a video on the survey conducted by them.

Thereafter Ms. Muskaan Dudeja under the guidance of Ms. Suchitra Srivastava presented her research on "Poly-bags Usage and Environmental Awareness among residents of NCR. The researcher highlighted on the fact that the microplastics have already entered our food chain and it is high time we focus on waste management techniques.

The next presentation was by Mr. Alok Chakraborty, Mr. Divansh Bhambry and Ms. Shristhti Bisht under the guidance of Ms. Anisha Tondon. The students presented on the topic " Comprehensive review of Sustainable development Goals and water, Sanitation and Health Analysis"

Therafter Ms. Sakshi Chhabra and Ms. Navita Kohli under the guidance of Ms. Anshu Punshi presented the paper on "Toilet- Not a Prem Katha but a need." The paper focussed on the harsh reality that people are not willing to use the toilets.

The next presenters were Ms. Megha Grover, Ms. Divyakshi Aneja and Ms. Shreya Garg from RDAIS who presented on the topic " A Study on sustainable development on STP(segmentation/targeting/positioning) of H&M and ZARA.

Therafter Mr. Aditya Seshadri and Mr. Niranjan Mahajan presented a paper on "Quality of Education with regard to SDGs" under the guidance of Dr. Sartaj Khera.

Afterwards Ms. Bhavya Pahuja under the guidance of Ms Anshu Punshi presented a paper on "Microfinance: Ensuring Financial Sustainability"

The next presentation was made by Ms. Vidhi Juneja under the guidance of Ms. Sanjna Aggarwal on the topic "Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure for sustainability."

And thereafter all the faculty and student researchers were awarded certificates for their presentations.











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Report of AWS Cloud Literacy Day Workshop






Inauguration of Workshop


concept of seminar. "The way technology has entered our lives, apocalypse may not be too far. It is time we realise the importance of human originality and the man behind the machine."





JIMS' alumnus Ms. Preeti Hoon, Media Consultant, Blogger shared her success tricks in the digital space in a candid chat with her juniors.







The Department of Media and Communication Studies of Jagannnath International Management School (JIMS), Vasant Kunj organised ICSSR Sponsored National Conference on 'Communicating Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)' on Wednesday, March 13th 2019 at the Deshmukh Auditorium, India International Center (IIC), New Delhi. The national conference was taken as an opportune moment to rethink about the transformational change and

consider the multi-dimensionality of communication for social innovation and encourage students to become a key stakeholder in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals target 2030.


Inaugural Session

The Conference began on a high note with the participation of luminaires from the field in the Inaugural Session. The Chief Guests for the day included Waterman of India, Dr. Rajendra Singh, eminent water conservationist & environmentalist, and Mr. Abhay Kumar, India's Ambassador-Designate to the Republic of Madagascar, Mr. Anil Sagar, Chief Reporter, Deshbandhu Newspaper along with Dr. Ravi K Dhar, Director, JIMS Vasant Kunj and Dr. Neeru Johri, Head, Department of Media and Communication Studies, JIMS Vasant Kunj.



Inaugural of the Conference

The Session began with the ceremonial lighting of the lamp and chanting of the peace prayer. This was followed by a welcome address by Dr. Ravi K Dhar, Director JIMS, Vasant Kunj, who set the tone for the Conference. He urged the students to be sensitive towards environmental issues facing the country. "Justice, equity and balance is an equation for *Dharma*. Man has created destruction and it is only after the state of balance that we can attain enlightenment. Hence, man needs to be at peace with nature and natural resources", said Dr. Dhar during his address.

Students welcomed Dr. Rajendra Singh, eminent water conservationist & environmentalist, popularly known as the Waterman of India with a standing ovation. In the keynote address Dr. Singh took students on a three-decade long journey of water conservation work undertaken by him in Rajasthan from 1985 - 2000. He coined the two key words for sustainability- discharge and recharge. Underlining the principles of sustainable development, Dr. Singh said, "Sustainable development is not possible without restoration and conservation and that it must be free from displacement, destruction and disaster."

He equated the role of rivers to that of a woman. As a woman gives birth to a child, rivers across the world have given birth to various civilizations. "India is a country of \overrightarrow{anx} (water), \overrightarrow{anx} (women signifying birth) and \overrightarrow{act} (river signifying flow of life),"said Dr. Singh. He added, "If we want to make India a global teacher again, we need to tackle international environmental challenges with indigenous knowledge systems."



Release of Book of Abstracts

A book of abstracts of the papers which were presented during the conference and a White Paper on River Ganga were released as part of the event by the eminent panelists.

Taking the session ahead, Mr. Anil Sagar, Chief Reporter, Deshbandhu Newspaper, enlightened students on the role and responsibility of a journalist in reporting SDGs. "If students really want to report and communicate on SDGs they should have a genuine concern for sustainability and the environment in their hearts," said Mr. Sagar.

Mr. Sagar's address was followed by the playing of the Earth Anthem. The Anthem has been penned by Mr. Abhay Kumar, India's Ambassador-Designate to the Republic of Madagascar. Mr. Kumar shared with students how he got the inspiration to write the earth anthem which was released in 2000, "We have national anthem, we have school anthem, why not have an earth anthem." Highlighting how the world has lost the flora and fauna, he said, "We have lost a lot of biodiversity in the last 50 years. Our greed has ruined the planet so we need to put our thoughts into action because this is the biggest existential crisis we are facing. As leaders of tomorrow we need to reduce the gap between our thoughts and our actions."

Technical Session 1: 'Sustainable Development Goals 2030'

The first technical session was chaired by Dr. Rashmi Sharma, Scientist at NCSTC GOI and it was co-chaired by Mr. Shibanand Rath, EKJUT-A, a non-profit organization based in Orissa, working towards affordable energy and healthcare.

Citing examples from tribal communities like the Bishnois to the Chipko Movement, Dr. Sharma said that the Sustainable Development Goals have always been part of the society before they were formally coined in 2015. She further discussed the 5-Ps model – People, Planet, Prosperity, Peace and Partnership to promote the participation of youth in SDGs. "Participation of youth will lead to the achievement of SDGs," said Dr. Sharma.

Mr. Rath spoke about the Crèche, a positive initiative undertaken by his NGO Ekjuta that works towards the eradication of malnutrition- child care facilities at home. He further urged people to apply scientific methods to overcome their problems rather than falling into the trap of self-victimisation.

After the chair and co-chair address, there were several paper presentations on various topics related to the SDGs.

Technical Session 2: 'Community initiatives, best practices and case studies along with challenges faced by CBOs, NGOs and Corporates'

The session on 'Community Initiatives, Best Practices, Innovations and Challenges Faced by NGOs, CBOs and Corporates' was chaired by Mr. Shubh Singh, Founder and CEO, New Fields Technologies Program Director – Universal Health Information Network. This informative session brought to light UN Sustainable Goal 3 – Good Health and Well Being for everyone. Mr. Shubh Singh spoke about the importance of digitizing health records, healthcare for females and children and the process for storing everything on the cloud.

The session included paper presentations from various participants including a presentation by Ms. Tahzeeb Fatma on 'the question of women in development'. She covered topics like taboos, traditions and gender inequality by referring to movies like Toilet – Ek Prem Katha and Padman.

Technical Session 3: 'Role of media networks including various forms of media engagements'

The final session of the day was chaired by Ms. Nandita Chibber, Head of Media and Communications at WaterAid India. Papers were presented on topics such as digital media, empowering gender equality, skill development and the challenges of fake news. Professors and scholars from various renowned universities presented their reports.

Ms. Chibber spoke about the after-Google era and the transformation of media in the digital age. "Media has a huge role to play in achieving the sustainable development goals," said Ms. Chibber. She showcased a viral campaign on drought affected rural villages made by WaterAid. She also shared how nowadays it is easier to popularise a cause through various social media platforms.

The Guest of Honour of the session was Mr. K.G Suresh, Director General, Indian Institute of Mass Communication (IIMC) and a renowned journalist. During his address, Mr. Suresh encouraged students to use social media to promote positive stories of change."Communication has become a monologue these days. The floodgates of information have been opened causing an information tsunami. It is important for media professionals to cover and spread positive stories of change and the information to be verified and to be packed with facts and figures," said Mr. Suresh.

A poster presentation was done by participants followed by distribution of certificates to the paper presenters. The event concluded with a Vote of Thanks extended to all the attendees by Dr. Neeru Johri, Head, Department of Media and Communication Studies, JIMS Vasant Kunj.


