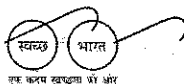
Our club completed the target of planting over a 1000+ saplings and with the help of our team of 95 student volunteers and faculty coordinators.

After plantation our team bonded with each other and with our faculty coordinators over some warm snacks and all together ended the drive on a positive note.



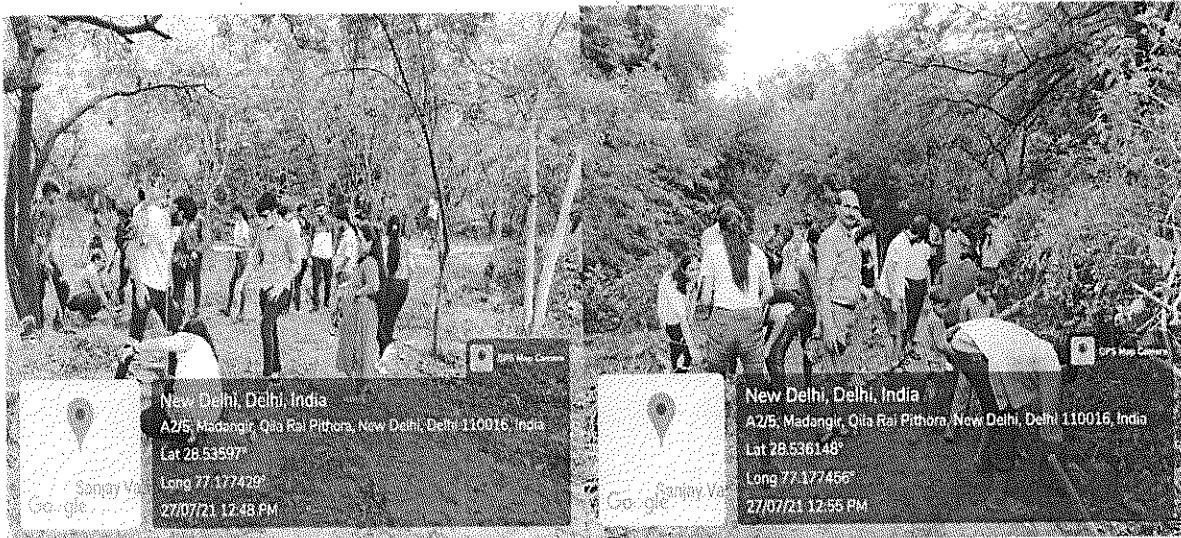

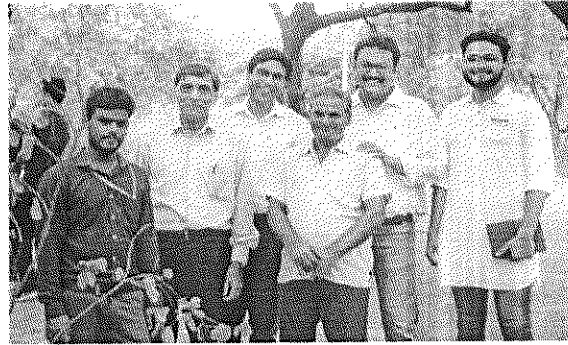
Report:

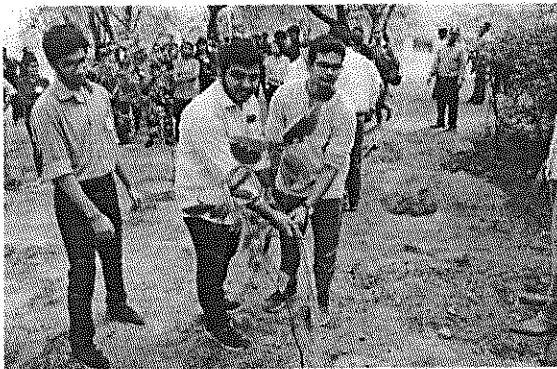

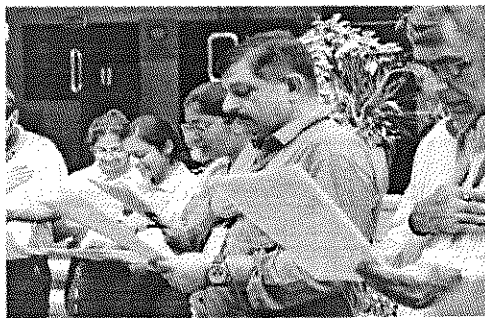

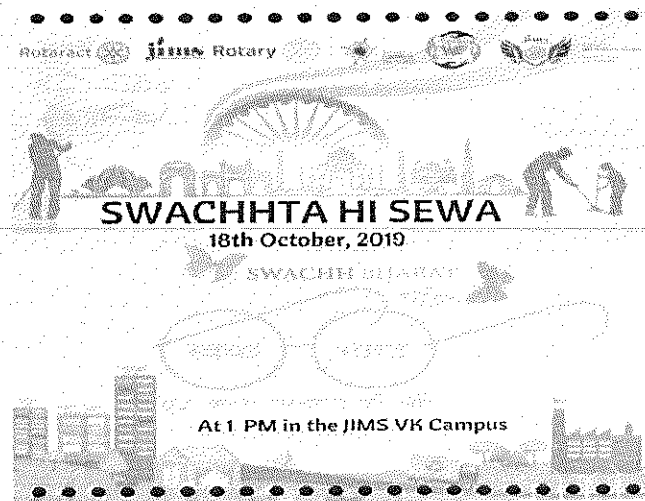

the roads to what they were before and what they had become after cleaning them. Everyone had an amazing experience, and it gave them an immense joy to see the clean roads.





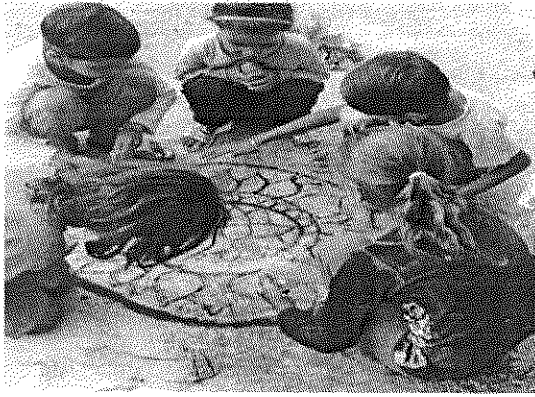

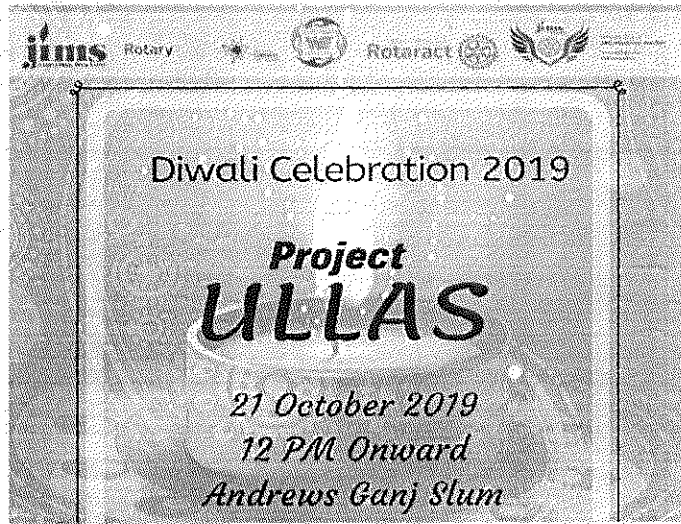

DATE - 21st January'2020

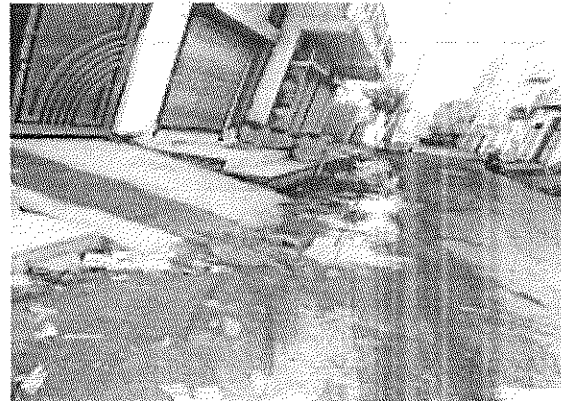
DESCRIPTION

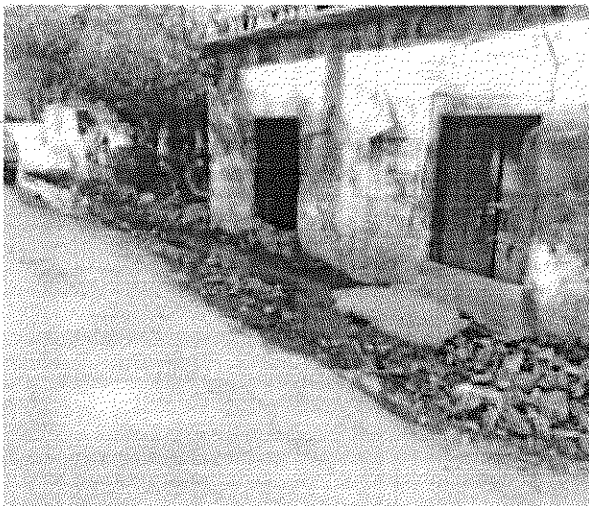
system, the sewage was blocked with garbage at various places. Drains were clogged and were not even covered. The locality also suffered from water logging during rainy season. Roads needed to be revamped. Waste management required a huge improvement in that area.

Situation of Roads and Water Pipes in Ghitorni Village

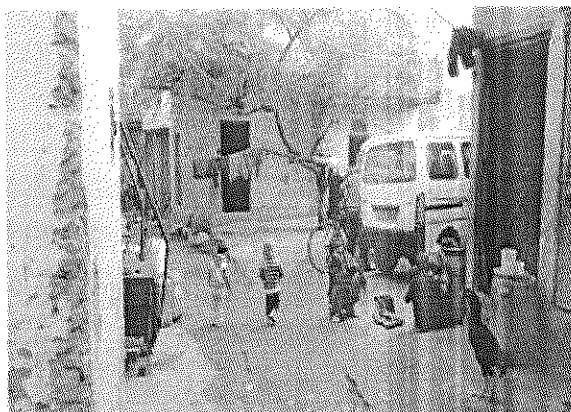
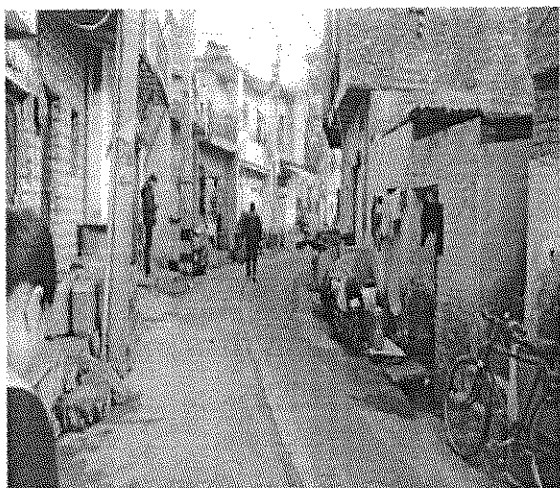
VILLAGE 2 – Kusumpur Pahadi

importance of waste management for the betterment in the standard of living of the residents in Kusumpur Pahadi.



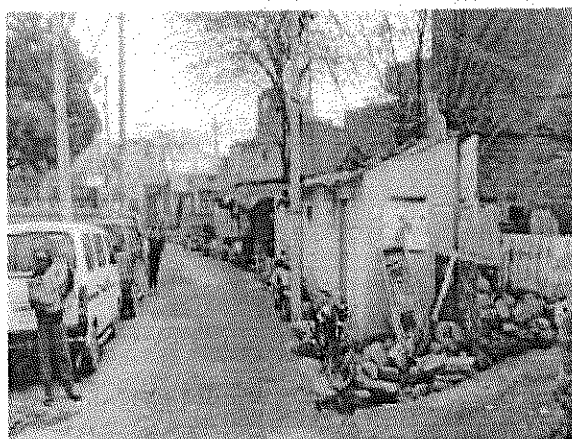
A view of the Kusumpur Pahadi residents with Water and Sanitation Conditions.

VILLAGE 3– Malik Pur Kohli alias Rang Puri

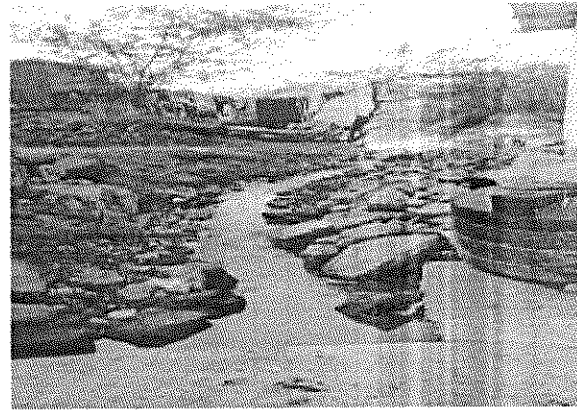
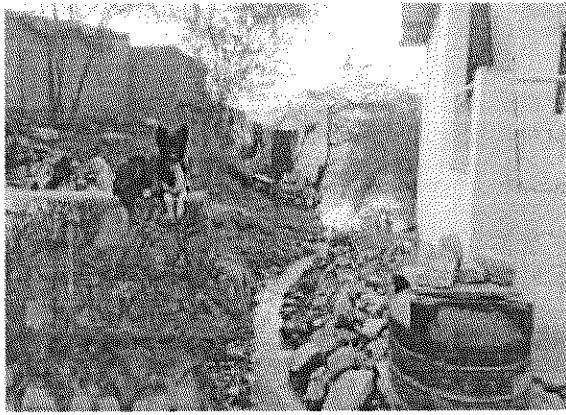
DATE - 22nd January 2020

They observed that the sanitation facilities in the locality were not proper. The sewage system was bad and they had the problem of water logging. Also, the roads were filled with potholes which made it difficult for the residents to transport goods and to travel. The whole slum was improved with proper sanitation facilities, sewage treatment for the betterment of the residents living in Rang Puri Pahadi.



Water and Sanitation Conditions in Rang Puri Pahadi



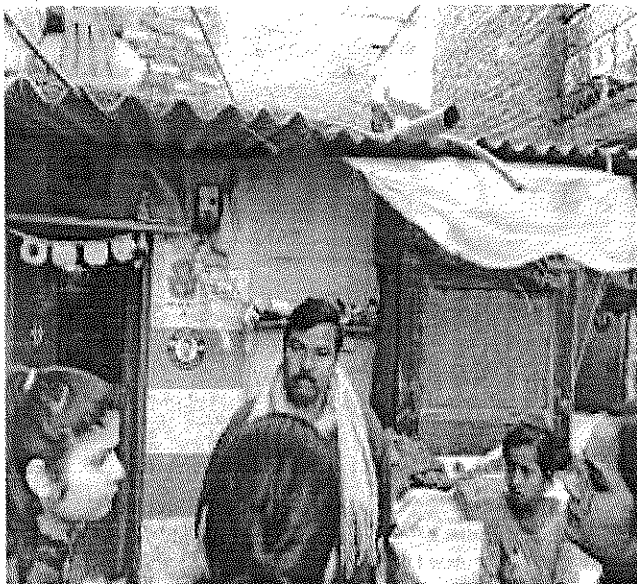

They were surprised to see the kindness and courtesy of the people living over there. They were happy with their regular life there with the help of Mr. Sonu Tawar who is the sarpanch of that area. He was happy with the water supply, electricity and drainage systems. One of the major difficulties they faced was the non-availability of dispensary in the locality. They had to travel a lot for medical help and treatment. The slum also required few security measures as thefts happened frequently. So, a security guard and a CCTV camera was installed for the wellbeing and upliftment of the residents living in Vasant Vihar slum.

VILLAGE 5 - Rajokri

DESCRIPTION

Rotaract Club of JIMS Vasant Kunj visited Rajokri Village on 24th January'2020 under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and conducted a survey. They observed that the sanitation facilities which were available in their houses were limited. There weren't any water taps in the village and the water that they get is through water tankers which comes daily but have limited water holding capacity in it. There was no appropriate garbage disposal system and there weren't proper electricity services whereas the electricity cables were not covered properly. The construction for proper drainage system had also stopped. They did not have proper RWA and the nearest police station was 10 kms away from the location. There was not any check point available. Also, they don't have any clinic nearby. For the past 16 years the roads weren't upgraded. The whole slum was improved with proper sanitation facilities, proper water facility, drainage system, roads, electricity facilities, and various other necessities including proper education were provided for the betterment of the residents living in Rajokri Village.

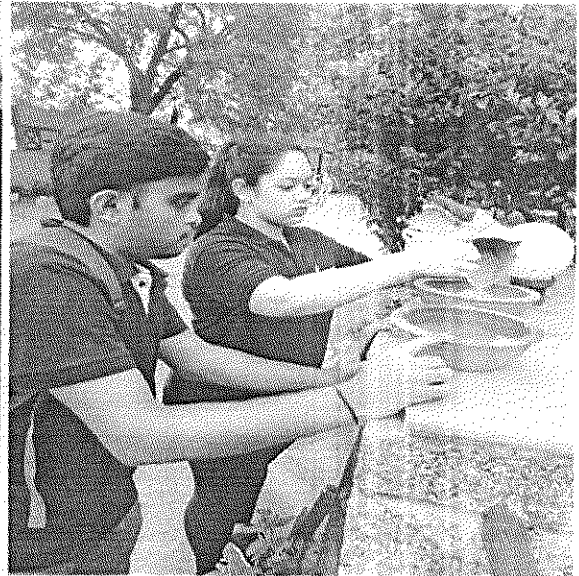
Phase 1 was about, "Establishing foundation" where 1524 saplings were planted to nurture our community and save nature.

Phase 2 was "Sustaining humanity" in which 6373 individuals in need were fed and last but not the least,






This event was organised as a small step to move towards a sustainable development. The club hopes to make more such small changes to create a big difference in the environment.

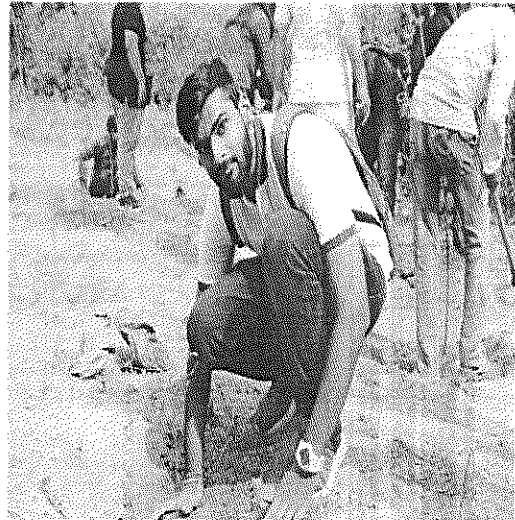

In total of 184 student and faculty volunteers took part in this drive. In this drive 600 saplings of fruit and medicinal trees were planted. This event was carried out in collaboration with Sanjay Van Authorities, DDA. 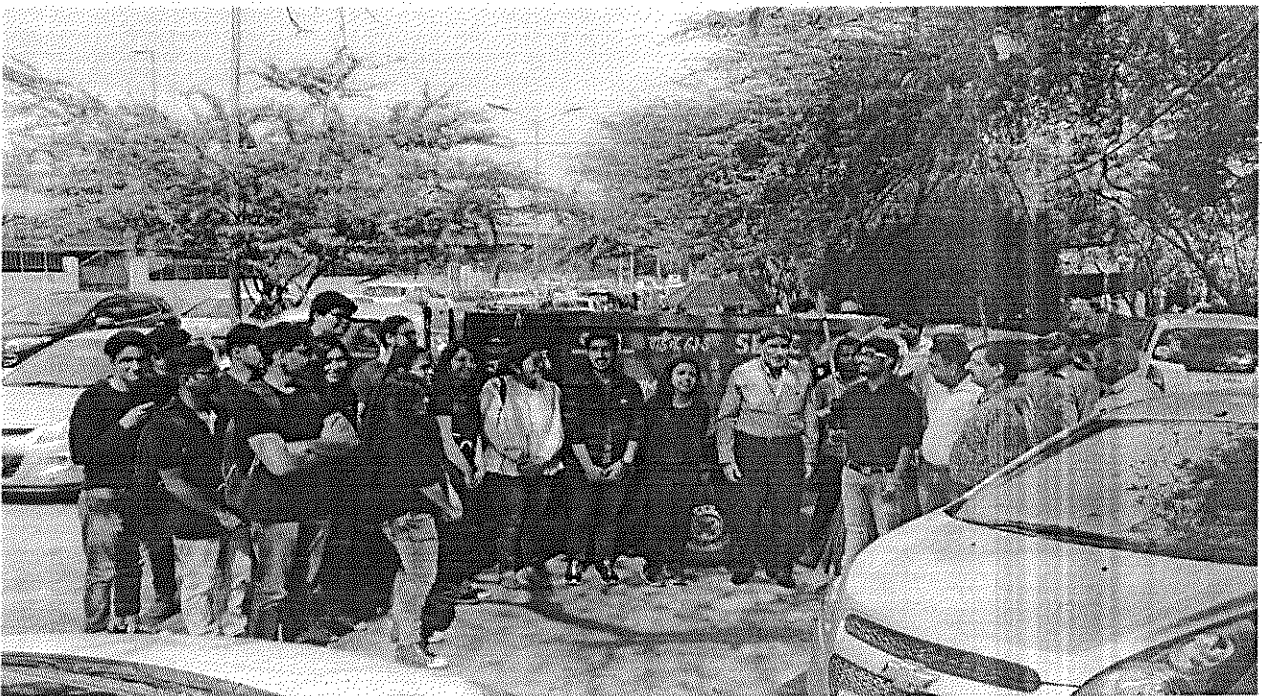

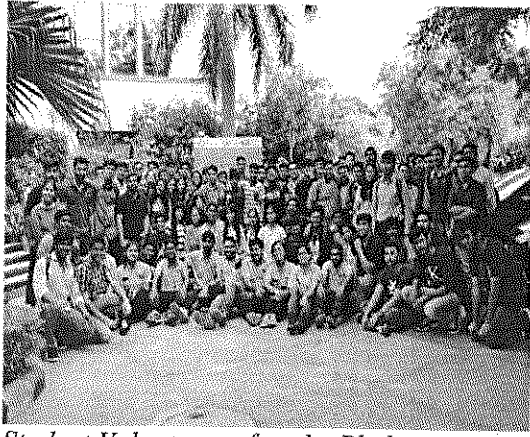

With the active participation of our Faculty members and students, the Swachhta Abhiyan was a resounding success.



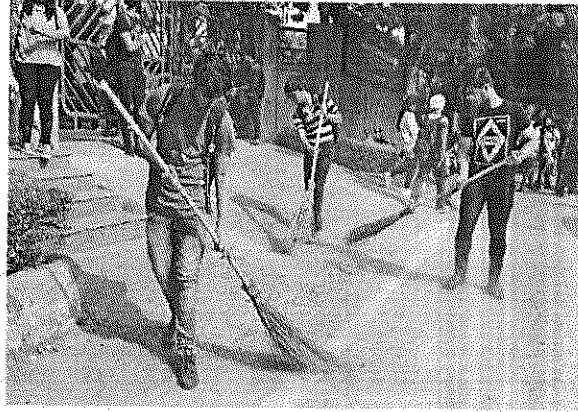

Plantation Drive

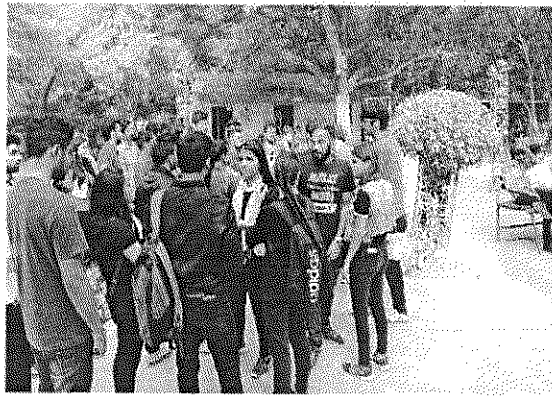

The students planted a number of indigenous varieties of plants such as Mahua and Gulmohar and also Picus Calendula.

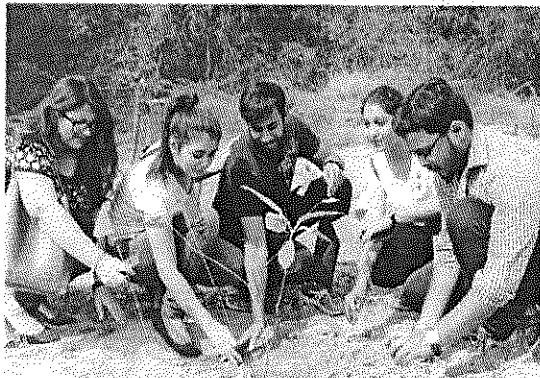

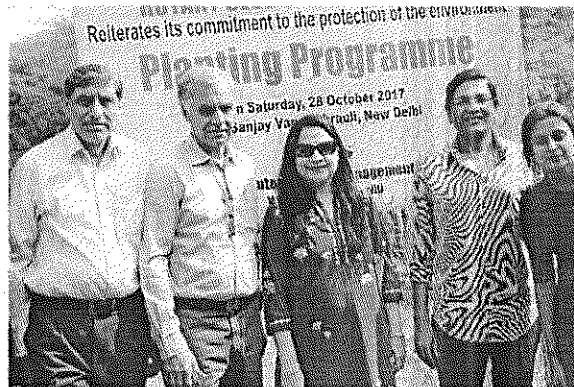
